

CCW MINUTES
Sunday, September 20, 2009 ~ 9 a.m.

1. This is the first CCW meeting with new officers: President Pat Annen, Vice-President Linda Schoepp, Treasurer Patti Kippley, and Secretary Julie Coquard.
2. The CCW received an advertising solicitation from the Catholic Herald, checking if we wanted to list events running through September 2010. It was decided to not pay for this listing of CCW events as the current method of contacting other parishes is working and the timing of some events is not known yet.
3. Several CCW groups have turned in the summary from the summer. Profit made from the brat stand was \$898, from the Family fun Fest was \$5133 (\$557 kitchen, \$172 games, \$1344 silent auction, \$3059 raffle), and Cow Chip Walking Taco Stand was about \$2200 (all numbers are not in yet). Many thanks to everyone one who volunteered their time to these events.
4. A thank you letter was received from Sauk Prairie Memorial Hospital for help given for delivering Meals on Wheels. A thank you was also received from Sister Haas for the mass given in honor of her mother.
5. The annual mass intention for the living and deceased members of the CCW will be Sunday, October 18 at the 8am mass. All women of the parish are invited to sit together at the front of church. Patti Kippley is reserving next year's CCW mass intention for the third weekend of October again.
6. Father Rudy's situation was explained. He is no longer a missionary in Costa Rica and is now back in the US in Georgia. A motion was made by Claire Statz to give \$1000 to Father Rudy's former mission, our sister parish, in Costa Rica. (This amount will be given at once instead of splitting it up as in past years.) and also give \$500 to Father Rudy in Georgia. Mary Breunig seconded the motion.
7. There will be a West Dane Deanery meeting on Tuesday, October 20 in Waunakee. The evening consists of a mass at 5:00 p.m., followed by a meeting, and dinner. The cost for the meal is \$10. The Deanery is also looking for donations of cold weather gear for children such as coats, mittens, etc. After the meeting and dinner, there will also be a speaker, open to the general public, Ryne Duren, who will be speaking at 7:30pm.
