The Madison Diocesan Eucharistic Congress

Friday, Sept. 29-Sunday, Oct. 1; St. John the Baptist, Waunakee

All weekend you will hear inspiring speakers, beginning with Fr. John Riccardo (English) and P. Agustin De la Vega (Spanish) on Friday evening. Come for the talks but stay for your soul, responding to Jesus' call for a deeper faith in the Eucharist.

Fr. John Riccardo (English):

A priest of the Archdiocese of Detroit, Fr. John Riccardo was ordained in 1996 and founded ACTS XXIX - Mobilizing for Mission in 2019 with Archbishop Allen Vigneron's blessing. Their work unleashes the gospel's power and equips clergy and lay leaders for transformation in the Church. They created The Rescue Project—rescueproject.us—to overwhelm, to move a person to surrender to the Lord, and to mobilize disciples for mission. His talk is "Getting Clarity on the Mission of the Disciple."

P. Agustín De la Vega, LC (Spanish):

As Fr. John is speaking on Friday evening in the main sanctuary, P. Agustín De la Vega, LC, will speak in Spanish in the small church. He is advisor of the World Federation of the Eucharistic Works of the Church. He also hosts and develops programming, including *Get Up and Walk*, *Walking through History*, and *Amor De Los Amores* for Guadalupe Radio. He gives two talks in Spanish, one on Friday, the other, on Sunday. Throughout the weekend, he will also be Confessor and Spiritual Director.

GO MAKE DISCIPLES TIP OF THE MONTH

The summer holidays are filled with parades, BBQ's and pool parties with family and friends. There are fairs, festivals and vacations, oh my! With all that is filling our calendars it can be easy to lose sight of our relationship with God and unintentionally put him on the back burner because we are "busy". Here are a few ideas to think about to prioritize God in your summer plans.

1. Make sure to still attend Mass weekly, either on Saturday or Sunday. Think about your weekend a day or so in advance. What games or events do you have scheduled, and which Mass does that mean your family will attend? If traveling out of town for the weekend, it's so easy to Google a Catholic church near where you'll be vacationing. Bonus points if you invite someone, you're spending that weekend with to Mass with you.
2. Find some quiet time for prayer and reflection. What are you thankful for? What do you need God's help with? Is there someone else in your life that you need to pray for? Consider stopping in for Adoration on a Thursday, or any other day, to help slow down and spend one-on-one uninterrupted time with God.

4. Soak up these sunshine-filled days during the month of August; don't forget to slow down and express gratitude for all the beauty God provides us.
