Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we enter the season of Ordinary Time, we are reminded that God is always with us in the ordinary moments of our lives, inviting us to grow closer to Him and to each other. This year, we have a special opportunity to grow as a community of faith, as we prepare to merge as one parish with our neighboring parishes.

As you may already know, Bishop Hying has decided to restructure the diocese and consolidate its parishes. This means that by the end of this year, we will no longer be separate parishes, but one united parish with a new name and a common vision.

This is a big change, and I know that some of you may have mixed feelings about it. You may feel sad, anxious, or even angry about losing your familiar parish identity or your cherished traditions. You may also feel excited, hopeful, or curious about the new possibilities, the new friendships, or the new ministries that await us. Whatever you feel, I want you to know that I understand and respect your emotions, and that I am here to accompany you in this transition.

To help us with this process, we have formed a transition team composed of representatives from each of the merging parishes. The transition team will meet regularly to explore all areas of parish life and to discern how best to proceed as we merge the parishes. The transition team will also communicate with you regularly to keep you informed.

One of our initial tasks is to choose three candidates for a new name for the parish. The name of the parish is not just a label, but a reflection of our identity, our mission, and our patronage. The transition team will propose Bishop Hying three names based on the suggestions we have received from you. I will send you a survey sometime next week to find out which name of the ones we are considering is more popular among parishioners.

I ask you to please pray for the transition team, for the merging parishes, and for the new parish that will emerge from this process. I also ask you to please participate in the survey. We need your collaboration and cooperation to make this transition a success.

I know that this is a challenging time for all of us, but I also believe that this is a grace-filled time for all of us. God is doing something new in our midst, and He is calling us to trust Him and to follow Him. Let us embrace this opportunity with faith, hope, and love, and let us look forward to the new beginning that awaits us.

May God bless you and keep you always.

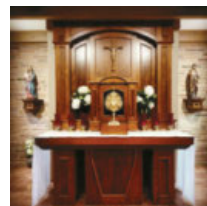
2024 DIOCESE OF MADISON ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL BEGINS

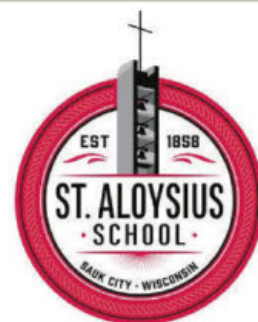
