MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY AT DIVINE MERCY

Divine Mercy Parish began the 8 session Sanctuary Course for Catholics last Tuesday, October 25 and will continue biweekly until course completion in February 2023. Surveys will follow to understand what is next desired by the parish.

This course will assist those suffering from mental illness, their families, and also educate and increase our awareness of their suffering. We will meet in room C in the St. Aloysius church basement beginning at 6:30pm on the following scheduled **Tuesdays: November 8, November 22, December 6 and December 20.**

The Sanctuary Course for Catholics was offered to the entire Diocese of Madison earlier this year. It is accompanied by compelling films that feature the stories of Catholics living with mental health challenges, along with the insights of archbishops, theologians and psychologists. All of these films can be found on FORMED.ORG and we will include small group discussion as a part of every class.

If you are interested in learning more about mental health issues to assist others, are supporting loved ones with mental health problems, or are currently living with mental health issues, we believe this course will be of help.

Our parish mental health ministry is not intended to replace professional services. We are trained in appropriate procedures to maintain the privacy of those with whom we relate. 40 DAYS FOR LIFE AT DIVINE MERCY PARISH

Divine Mercy Parish will once again promote and publicize 40 Days for Life September 28 to November 6.

Although abortion is now illegal in Wisconsin, the goal of Vigil for Life, Madison, has always been the permanent closure of the Planned Parenthood facility in Madison. It is not permanently closed yet. Although they are not currently performing surgical abortions, they are referring out for abortions during their "pregnancy counseling" sessions. However, they are giving no support to mothers who choose life for their babies as do the Women's Care Center and other pro-life resources who are available with their kind, compassionate, generous assistance.

Prayers, promotion and support of the following organizations who assist new mothers and their babies is a key component of 40 Days for Life:

- Women's Care Center (womenscarecenter.org) is present in Madison and in another 12 states and offers help to pregnant mothers and their babies.
- Care Net Pregnancy Center (care-net.org) is present in Madison and all across North America and offers help to mothers and their babies, including housing.
- 40 Days for Life (40daysforlife.com/en/pregnancyhelp) references free help for new mothers.- Walking with Moms in Need (walkingwithmoms.com) is a nationwide effort for Catholic parishes and communities to help pregnant mothers and their families and is an ongoing effort of training, prayer and support.

Tia shared this about the Women's Care Center: "You changed everything for me. You went above and beyond. You got me in touch with a center for domestic violence. You didn't have to check in with me so often, but you did anyway. There is no other place like this. Everything you need, all in one stop. You provided my daughter's crib and play pen. And when the car seat you had wouldn't fit in my old car, you special-ordered one for me." To all donors, Tia says, "Thank you! I was able to restart and I am a homeowner. I have stability I never would have without you". Please join in praying and fasting once again during this 40 Day period for the unborn and for new mothers and their babies.
