GO MAKE DISCIPLES TIP OF THE MONTH

The January tip from your GMD group is about starting 2023 as a stronger Catholic and setting some faith forward resolutions for you and your family. The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, which is celebrated on Jan 3rd. The first ten days of January fall during the liturgical season known as Christmas which is represented by the liturgical color white, and the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored). The remaining days of January are the beginning of Ordinary Time, which is represented by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. This year set your goals for the 4 Pillars of Go Make Disciples: 15 minutes of daily prayer- Reclaiming Sunday- Monthly Confession-Friday Penance. Juanita shared the Financial report for the absent CCW Treasurer, Jeanne Walsh. The expenses for December were to Divine Mercy Parish for 7 Masses for those we sent Christmas cards to, Lucy Kippley for Father James' Anniversary of Ordination gathering, Judy Endres for Fr. James' Anniversary of Ordination gathering, Ace Sauk Prairie for flowers, Care Net donation, St. Norbert's Religious Education Program for teacher salaries, Fr.
