MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY AT DIVINE MERCY

Divine Mercy Parish has now finished their 5-week mental health gatherings. The recordings are found on our Divine Mercy Parish website <https://www.divinemercury-parish.org> under our blog as well as the Sanctuary Course trailer for possible upcoming events.

This past Tuesday night, speakers from local resources presented what is available to assist those in need. Sharon Rapnicki, Certified Peer Specialist from NAMI spoke of her struggles with mental illness and the help and hope that is available with NAMI, National Alliance on Mental Illness. Alexander Liberatore from Samaritan Christian Counseling of Southern Wisconsin also dealt with mental illness and was helped by counseling. He and other counselors at Samaritan offer online counseling, caring for body, mind and spirit. Jess Kaehny from Hope House in Baraboo presented their resources on abuse prevention, including counseling, legal advocacy and shelter. Christy Wehler from Farmer Angel Network detailed their education and resources for farmers. Debbie Johnson, LPN, Sauk Prairie Care Recovery Program Director at St. Vincent presented her many resources for addiction.

All of their materials were set up on tables and included many available resources for people suffering from mental illness, their families, or those who wish to learn more about this ongoing suffering in our community. These resources are now in the side lobby of St. Aloysius. We also had a survey available to better understand what should be planned to follow our course. This survey is also available in both lobbies near our mental health brochures. Please return this survey to the parish office in the envelope provided.

We watched the trailer to the Sanctuary Course for Catholics, an 8 week course including video, work book and small group discussion. This video can be viewed on the Divine Mercy Parish website. Please contact us if you are interested in taking this class as a group.

Thank you all for attending and learning as we venture into this new ministry and thank you to Brenda Murphy who devoted much time and energy for coordinating the speakers for our 5 week class.

Our parish mental health ministry is not intended to replace professional services. We are trained in appropriate procedures to maintain the privacy of those with whom we relate. We all continue to be involved in diocesan mental health training. 40 DAYS FOR LIFE AT DIVINE MERCY PARISH

Divine Mercy will once again promote and publicize 40 Days for Life September 28 - November 6. **Monday, October 17 @ 8:15am:** Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at St. Aloysius Church with special intention for the unborn and all of those affected by abortion. 3rd through 5th grade students and their teachers will pray the prolific rosary following Mass. The school children are also planning special prayers and activities during the campaign.

In addition, we pray, promote and support the organizations who assist new mothers and their babies, including the Women's Care Center in Madison. Jenny Hunsberger, Vice President, states: *"Women come to us, and we meet them where they are. We welcome them as they are right now. And when you say to someone, 'You are good, and your goodness is your defining characteristic. It is who you are. And it's unchangeable'... what we find is that when women encounter that, when they remember their own goodness --- maybe it's been forgotten, maybe no one's ever told them -- it is in that space that women make decisions for life"*.

Please join in praying and fasting once again during this 40 Day period for the unborn and for new mothers and their babies. Prayers including the prolific mysteries of the rosary can be found on the stands in the Divine Mercy lobbies.
