May 18, 2023

I. Old Business

A. Call to Order - Brad Walsh/Fr James Kotch.

B. Fr. James led Parish Council in opening prayer. Minutes of March 23, 2023 Parish Council meeting were read by Mary Briggs. Correction: Record amended to show that Juanita Wipperfurth is a non-voting attendee, not a Parish Council Member.

C. Go Make Disciples (GMD) - Parishioner Dan Pethan, a GMD representative, read a statement from Tara Breunig about the purpose of GMD. Members include: Tara Breunig, the liaison between the parish and Madison Diocese GMD, Michelle Zeigler, Georgia Breunig, Rod Holler, Ashley Ballweg and Fr. James. The group was started three years ago by Fr. Jerry in response to Bishop Hying's call. The group continues under the guidance of Fr. James. Four main cornerstones of GMD are daily prayer, reclaiming Sunday, Friday penance and monthly confession. Dan gave his own testimony on GMD's positive spiritual impact it has made on his readiness to spread the Catholic faith with others. Fr. James stated GMD representatives are seeking to spread the positive impact with other lay leaders in the parish. Some of these groups include Parish Council, CCW, Knights of Columbus and others. Paul and Karen Merline are going to the Diocesan GMD training meetings on Evangelization and will provide guidance to St. Norbert's as GMD progresses.

Financial Update - Fr. James

1. All accounts are transferred to Bank of Prairie du Sac.

2. Status of Capital Campaign Pledges - Fr. James

a. Total collected to date: \$1, 209,565.54

b. Total outstanding pledges: \$46,675.00

c. Total collected and remaining balance to collect: \$1, 256, 240.54

d. Balance at the Bank of Prairie Du Sac in the Capital Campaign Account: \$154,275.68

3. Stained Glass Window Repair

a. Total collected to date: \$164,455.00

4. Other

a. \$4,000.00 received and earmarked for the sound system. Amount is deposited in regular account.

b. An anonymous donation of \$25,000.00 was gratefully accepted by St. Norbert Parish and will help defray costs for stairway refurbishing.

D. Building and Grounds

1. Maintenance Committee Update- Brad Walsh

a. Rectory electrical repairs completed to satisfaction. Consecrated women are grateful.

b. The SSI from Wisconsin Dells bid for parking lot repairs and maintenance came in at \$15,845.00. The bid was accepted. The Dorf Haus has generously offered to pay half. Thank you to the Maier and Frey Families and the Dorf Haus for their generous good neighbor gift.

c. Rectory electrical work was completed by Mayberry Electric, who donated their time, materials and labor. Thank you, Mayberry Electric.

d. Other projects are still in process but on track to completion, including the sink hole by the garage.

e. Stairways and Handicap Ramp: Nick Ballweg presented the bid from Endres Manufacturing privately to Brad Walsh. Brad explained details of the bid to the Parish Council. The bid was \$75,000.00. Included in bid for both stairs and ramp are parts and materials of galvanized steel framing, which will be in keeping with appearance of the railings of the front steps of main church. Composite treads, concrete work and installation not included in bid. Parish member contractors will supply labor and materials when possible to decrease costs. Brad hopes to sign off on the bid soon after minor negotiations. Approval from Finance Committee to be sought. Bidding process must be approved by Finance Committee. Thereupon, an email vote will be sent to Parish Council members for a timely response.

2. Introduction of Landscape Committee Members - Brad

a. Jackey Drone, Jeanne Walsh (not present), Juanita Wipperfurth, and Mary Briggs

b. Jackey updated Parish Council on the progress of a pictorial document being prepared by the committee which gives a general overview of specific areas and their needs. Goal of the overview is to prioritize immediate and long range maintenance needs. All will be done in consultation with the Maintenance Committee and Parish Council.

3. Catholic Mutual Inspection follow-up - Juanita

a. Tempered glass installed under vigil lights.

b. Date for Travelers boiler inspection is to be set up soon.

4. Jefferson Fire and Safety inspection and AED work - Fr. James/Juanita

a. The AED was replaced.

b. Tim Knobloch placed a first aid kit near AED. Thank you Tim.

5. Shoreless School use of RE Center update - Fr. James
 - a. Due to a sewer back up at the Shoreless Lake School facility in Sauk City, permission was given by Fr. James and the parish Council to allow them to use the RE Center until repairs were completed, which took about ten business days. Both teachers and students expressed gratitude for the use of the spacious RE Center and attendance at daily Mass.
6. Lawn mower tune up – Juanita
 - a. Completed by Davis Mower Repair

II. New Business

- A. Into the Deep Update - Fr. James
 1. Fr. Miguel Galvez recently attended a Diocesan meeting for Pastors and Parish Administrators to prepare for the transition of Into the Deep. Copious amounts of materials were given to Fr. Galvez, who is in the process of preparing implementation, which will take time and much patience.
 - a. All parishes will combine previous separate bulletins into one.
 - b. At some date a merger of parish councils, religious education and book keeping will take place, but no details are determined as of yet.
 2. Senior Mass is Sunday, May 21, 2023 - Megan and Juanita
 - a. 24 people have RSVP'd and will attend Mass and breakfast.
 3. Confirmation is May 24, 2023 at Divine Mercy Parish - Mary Markielewski / Mary Briggs
 - a. Mary M. stated six Bibles were wrapped and delivered to Miss Silvana for presentation at Confirmation.
- B. Brat Stand is May 26 - 29, 2023 in the Piggly Wiggly parking lot, Sauk City - Chris/Sharon
 1. Because volunteers were still needed at some shifts, Chris offered to take more lead shifts to cover.
 - a. Chris recommended the purchase of a generator in order to bring more energy reliability to the Piggly Wiggly site and for future flexibility in brat stand placement. Doug Haselwander made a motion to have the KC's share the cost of purchasing the generator with the Parish Council. Motion was seconded by Julianne Brickl. Motion approved.
 - b. Chris proposed buying five coolers for the Brat Stand. He found good coolers at Costco for \$149.00 each. Doug Haselwander proposed KC's will pay for two coolers. Juanita Wipperfurth, CCW Officer, proposed that CCW would pay for one cooler and Brad proposed Parish Council would pay for two coolers. Motion approved.
- C. Bishop Hying coming to St. Norbert, June 1, 2023 update - Fr. James
 1. Bishop Hying will come for a Eucharistic Holy Hour on June 1, 2023 from 6:30 – 7:30 pm. He is promoting the Eucharistic Congress on September 29 - October 1, 2023 in Waunakee . He will begin with private prayer and give a homily on the Eucharist and end with further prayer. Parish Adoration will continue as normally scheduled throughout the night.
 2. KC's are hosting a meet and greet with the Bishop immediately after in the basement of church and will provide light appetizers. Parish Council members will make desserts. Plan on 100 to attend.
- D. Last *Traditional Latin Mass* and Parish Pot Luck, June 30, 2023 - Fr. James
 1. A TLM Solemn High Mass will be celebrated on Friday, June 30, 2023 at 6:00 pm.
 2. A parish wide potluck is hosted by the *TLM* community to offer thanks to the parish and parishioners for the years of shared space in prayer and worship. Attendees are asked to bring a meatless dish to pass. All are welcome to attend both the Mass and the potluck.

III. Other Business

- A. Fr. James will be in Spain from August 21 – September 21, 2023.
- B. Safety Committee - Fr. James/Juanita
 1. The Diocese of Madison hosted an information meeting concerning keeping your parish safe.
 2. A Safety Committee will be formed and will tentatively include Eric Breunig, Brad Walsh and Fr. James. Individuals interested in becoming a member of the Safety Committee are asked to contact Fr. James or Eric Breunig.
 - a. Parishioner, Detective Andrew Lewis will meet with the committee to discuss adequate safety and evacuation plans.
- C. Baseball diamond is in use 6 days a week through the summer – Brad/Juanita
 1. The Sauk Prairie School District discovered that newly renovated ball diamonds at the Middle School were not safe for play. They are in litigation with the contractor to bring about a resolution to the safety issue.
 2. The Recreation Department provides excellent maintenance to the diamond at their expense throughout the season and postseason. In addition, they continue to pay for all their light usage.
- D. Next Parish Council Meeting date – Fr. James/Juanita
 1. Due to Into the Deep process, there is uncertainty how Parish Council membership will be determined as the parishes become one pastorate. To be prudent, a tentative date is scheduled for September 28, 2023 at 7:00 pm, with the realization that may likely change.
 2. No Parish Council elections will be run at this time.
 3. Julianne Brickl, Stephen Howard and Steve Schoepp, Parish Council members who have fulfilled their three year commitment are deeply thanked for all that they have done for St. Norbert Parish.
 4. Active Parish Council members will remain in their roles as needed until such time that a new alignment of parish Councils is elected.
