I want to extend my most sincere thanks to all of you who have offered such kind birthday wishes and sent cards as I approach a significant milestone. This coming Monday, September 29, I will turn 50 on the great feast of St. Michael the Archangel, my patron saint whose name I am proud to bear.

As I celebrate this 50th birthday, I cannot help but reflect on the passage of time and God's immense goodness. It is remarkable to think that next March it will be 25 years since I was ordained a priest, and next year December will mark 20 years since I originally arrived here in Sauk City. I am profoundly grateful for the honor of serving as the parochial administrator for the three parishes in our pastorate (and I look forward to hopefully becoming pastor when we merge next year).

I am so blessed to have a great staff and, most especially, great parishioners. It is a gift to serve our wonderful families, our growing families, and all the children who bring such life to our community. One of the unique blessings of staying in one place for so long is the ability to watch an entire generation grow.

It is a particular joy and a profound consolation for me to see a good number of our young parents with a desire to be generous; to have all the children that God may want to give them, to form their children to be saints, to build a legacy, and to do something more for our Church and culture than just guarantee that their kids have a good future. As your priest, there is nothing that I desire to see more than this.

This brings me to the topics you may hear me speak of often, which have perhaps become recurring: holiness, growth in virtue, and the need to evangelize a post-Christian society. I return to these themes because this is the great need of our time. We must all become aware that keeping our Faith private or simply going through the motions will not be enough to persevere in these times.

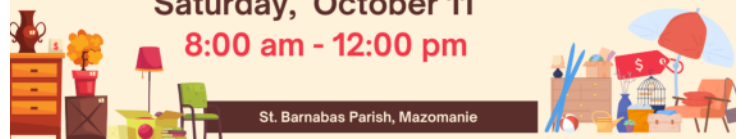
