MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY STARTED

Divine Mercy Parish began their 5 week mental health gatherings last week. Fr. Miguel began with a welcome and prayer and Debbie Deborah Johnson, LPN, Recovery Coach & Client Coordinator of St. Vincent de Paul Resource Center, spoke of her mission with people with addiction. As coordinator of a weekly support group and Sauk Prairie Al-anon, she introduced Derek and Nathan who spoke of their years of mental illness and addiction to alcohol and drugs and their courageous journey through recovery. Many hearts were moved with their stories.

Sessions will continue for the next 4 Tuesday evenings, 6:30pm – 8pm in Room C in the church basement. We offer these nights to people suffering from mental illness, their families, or those who wish to learn more about this ongoing suffering in our community.

Tuesday evening, **September 20**, Justin Bangert, MS, LMFT from The Psychology Clinic, Prairie du Sac and The Center for Christian Counseling, Madison, will be our main presenter.

Following 3 nights will include:

- * Ministry to People with Mental Illness and Their Families
- * Spirituality and Mental Illness.
- * How can we Minister to People With a Mental Illness and Their Families (our Information Fair tables)

There will also be opportunities for small group discussion for those interested and this will not be recorded.

Decisions will be made about offering an ongoing support group or more educational opportunities in our parish after the last class.

Our parish mental health ministry is not intended to replace professional services. We are trained in appropriate procedures to maintain the privacy of those with whom we relate. We all continue to be involved in diocesan mental health training. GO MAKE DISCIPLES TIP OF THE MONTH

How often do we as human beings choose to give up something in order to better ourselves physically and or mentally? My guess is pretty regular or as often as every day. I ask you how often do you give up something for your spirituality? Often noise, activity, material possessions and satisfaction of our cravings take up all of our existential space leaving little room for our Lord to speak, live, and act within us. In this sense, mortification is a subtraction not in addition. We empty ourselves out so Christ can fill us. In our primary vocation of the pursuit of holiness we should have regular mortification. We all have many opportunities every day to "take up our cross" with all of our life's little inconveniences and annoyances that choose us. We can take them with a cheerful heart and a smiling face. I ask you to also include an active mortification at least once a week on Fridays. Most traditionally abstaining from meat. Whatever you choose offer it up to God intentionally. The more we freely deny ourselves even in legitimate pleasures and comforts in the littlest things the easier it will be to resist a moment of temptation in the bigger things.
