



Divine Mercy Sunday was celebrated on April 7 at St. Aloysius Church in Sauk City and may be best portrayed by the results that followed. The Divine Mercy image and the 1st class relic of St. Faustina were surrounded by flowers and available for veneration all afternoon. Following Benediction, a delicious taco dinner hosted by the hardworking Hispanic Knights of Columbus was available in the school gym. It was a memorable coming together of cultures and parishioners sharing their immense love for our Lord and for each other.


