

Dear Parishioners,

This coming week, we enter a special time in our liturgical calendar. It begins with the cultural holiday of Halloween and leads us directly into two of the Church's most profound celebrations: the Solemnity of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls.

The Solemnity of All Saints is Saturday, November 1st. This is a joyous and primary feast day when we celebrate the "Church Triumphant"—all the holy men and women, known and unknown, who have finished their race and now stand in the glory of God's presence.

It is important to note that this year, the Solemnity of All Saints is not a Holy Day of Obligation. The U.S. Bishops' Conference has decreed that when this solemnity falls on a Saturday or a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is lifted.

However, just because it is not obligatory does not mean it is not important! We strongly encourage all parishioners to join us for Mass to honor the saints and ask for their powerful intercession.

It is no coincidence that All Saints Day follows October 31st. The very name "Halloween" is a contraction of its original Christian title: "All Hallows' Eve."

"Hallow" is an old English word for "holy" or "saint." Therefore, Halloween was the eve, or the vigil, of All Hallows' Day (All Saints Day). Like Christmas Eve, it was a time of prayer and fasting to prepare for the great feast to come.

In our modern culture, Halloween has become a day of costumes, candy, and fun. There is certainly nothing wrong with enjoying this as a time of community and imagination.

However, the holiday often focuses on a morbid curiosity with death—ghosts, ghouls, and horror. As Christians, our faith calls us to look much deeper. We cannot be a people who trivialize death. Death is a profound, solemn, and—for us—sacred reality.

For the Christian, death is not a ghoulish end. It is the sacred passage into eternal life, a door opened for us by the suffering, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. We are called to look at death not with morbid fear, but with holy hope.

Our respect for this sacred passage continues on November 2nd, All Souls' Day, when we pray for all the faithful departed. This respect also extends to the way we treat the mortal remains of our loved ones.

The body was a "temple of the Holy Spirit" in life and awaits the final resurrection. Because of this dignity, the Church teaches that all mortal remains must be given a final, dignified resting place.

This is a crucial reminder for all of us, especially regarding cremation. The Church permits cremation, but with an important rule: all cremated remains (cremains) must be interred or entombed. They must be laid to rest in a sacred place, like a cemetery or a columbarium. It is not permissible to scatter ashes, keep them at home, or divide them among family

members. This practice honors the sanctity of the body and our profound hope in the resurrection.

This week, let us enjoy the fun of Halloween but also reclaim the holiness of these days. Let us celebrate the saints in heaven, and let us pray for the souls on their journey, treating all the departed with the dignity and respect they deserve.


COFFEE AND DOUGHNUTS AFTER MASS THIS SUNDAY
