Dear Parishioners,

As we turn the page into 2026, I want to wish each of you and your families a truly blessed and happy New Year.

This time of year, the world loves “resolutions.” Gym memberships, new diets, new planners, new versions of ourselves. There’s nothing wrong with wanting to improve, but the world’s idea of a resolution often sounds like: “Try harder. Be stronger. Reinvent yourself.” And then, when we stumble (as human beings do), the whole thing quietly dissolves by mid-January.

The Christian view is steadier, more realistic, and far more hopeful. A Catholic “resolution” is less about reinventing ourselves and more about returning to the Lord. Not “new me,” but “Lord, make me Yours.” The saints did not become saints by perfect streaks and flawless discipline. They became saints by daily conversion, by getting up again, by confessing when they fell, and by letting grace do what sheer willpower cannot.

So what might a Catholic New Year’s resolution look like?

Maybe it’s not a dramatic makeover, but a simple spiritual anchor:

- Pray every day, even if it’s brief and imperfect.
- Get to Sunday Mass faithfully, and add one weekday (or more!) Mass when possible.
- Make a good confession regularly, not as a punishment, but as a cleansing and a strengthening.
- Read Scripture a little each day, letting God’s Word shape your thoughts more than the headlines do.
- Practice charity at home first, where it costs the most and matters the most.

Small, steady, grace-filled steps. Holiness is usually built with quiet bricks.

And providentially, the Church gives us a perfect way to begin the year: January 1 is a Holy Day of Obligation, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. While the culture begins the year with noise and recovery, the Church begins it with worship. We start the year not with a slogan, but with an altar. Not with “I will,” but with “God is faithful.”

This Holy Day matters because it reminds us of something essential: time belongs to God, and so do we. Placing the first day of the year under Mary’s maternal care is not sentimental. It is profoundly practical. A mother teaches her children how to live. Mary teaches us how to receive Christ, how to trust,

how to persevere, how to say “yes” when it’s easier to say “later.”

So I ask you: please make Mass on January 1 a priority. Begin 2026 the way Christians have always begun the future, by putting God first. If you’ve been carrying burdens, bring them. If you’re grateful, bring that too. If you’re anxious about what lies ahead, place it in the hands of the Lord, and ask Our Lady to help you keep your heart steady. May God bless this New Year for you with deeper faith, stronger hope, and a love that grows practical and joyful. And may Mary, Mother of God, keep you close to her Son all year long.


Our Christmas Movie Madness fundraiser came to an end on Friday, December 19. The students joined together in the gym for a movie and popcorn party.


