## MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY AT DIVINE MERCY

Divine Mercy Parish continues with their 5 week mental health gatherings and the recordings are found on our parish Divine Mercy's website <https://www.divinemercury-parish.org> under our blog.

This past Tuesday night, Sauk County Public Health Educator Kate Stough MPH MCHES presented a very educational program on suicide prevention. Kate highlighted the growing rate of suicide in our county and offered some very helpful tips and advice noted in the QPR program on suicide prevention. Instructing all on the warning signs of suicide, she presented participants with helpful questions and followed this with the next steps to persuade and refer. All were quite pleased with learning ways to help others in need.

Sessions will continue for the next 2 Tuesday evenings, 6:30pm – 8pm in Room C in the church basement. We offer these nights to people suffering from mental illness, their families, or those who wish to learn more about this ongoing suffering in our community.

Tuesday evening, **October 4** Fr. Miguel will be our main presenter as he discusses the connections between spirituality and mental illness. The last night will include: How can we Minister to People With a Mental Illness and Their Families (our Information Fair tables) and a survey to understand what should be planned to follow our course

There will also be opportunities for small group discussion for those interested and this will not be recorded. Our parish mental health ministry is not intended to replace professional services. We are trained in appropriate procedures to maintain the privacy of those with whom we relate. We all continue to be involved in diocesan mental health training. Father James opened the meeting with a prayer.

Glenn Mack shared with Council members the story behind the Lilac bush that is near the South entrance of the Church. The bush was planted by Father Shering when he arrived in Roxbury. The root stock that he used originated from a bush that was by the original church area by the Roxbury creek. Due to its long lineage and history with the Church, Glenn wants to see it remain for many more years and to be taken care of.

John Breunig has installed 2 new microphones in the Choir loft and fixed the floor jack in the Sanctuary. Thank you to John for all of his help.

Brian Breunig freshened up playground areas with several inches of playground certified wood chips to meet safety needs. Thank you Brian and Breunig Lawn Care team.

Stained glass window repair was completed and Father James and Chris Goodwin were very pleased with Willet Houser and work performed. The final cost of the repairs was \$147,875 which was slightly under bid. Remaining funds from donations will be put toward projects on the wish list.

All stumps have been removed from the parish grounds. Thank you to the great work completed by Jerome Ballweg, Russ Ballweg, and Doug Ballweg.

Mark Maier worked with Mayberry electric to straighten the electrical pole by the garage. Thank you to Gerard Ballweg and Mayberry Electric for their donation of time and materials. Mark is also going to work with MGE to see why a sink hole is forming in that area and if it is related to the gas line there.

Chris Goodwin recently treated the 2 remaining Ash trees on the grounds that are in good condition. Thank you to Chris for his donation in working to save these trees for years to come.

A new computer was purchased for the RE Center/Parish. Thank you to Brad Herbrand for helping to transfer Parish files to the new computer.

Thank you to Suellen Kruchten and Mark Ruhland who covered cleaning and maintenance while Tim Knobloch was on vacation.

Mark Maier reported on the water situation in the bell tower and based on his inspection believes we need to replace the decking and add a drain. This is also likely the cause of the water leak in the hall storage room. Brad Walsh volunteered to call Hashieder Roofing for review and quote.

We discussed that without air conditioning it would be helpful to have larger fans to move the air all year around. Brad Walsh volunteered to check into industrial fans and if there are any that would fit our Church aesthetics.

Father James to confirm that the boiler motors have been replaced by Hillestad Heating and Cooling.

Father James to follow up with Tom Howard regarding the replacement of the video camera for streaming Mass downstairs.

The steeple of the Church is now beautifully lit at night. A big thank you to the Maier and Frey families and Mayberry Electric for their idea and generosity in making this a reality.

Thank you to the anonymous team that decorated the main entrance with flowers, statue and cross. What a beautiful addition to the Church grounds.
