

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings of peace and joy to you all!

As you know, our three parishes of Divine Mercy, St. Norbert, and Holy Cross are in the process of forming a new parish as part of the Diocese of Madison's *Into the Deep* plan. This is an exciting and challenging time for us, as we seek to become one family of faith, united in our mission to proclaim the Gospel and serve the Lord.

One of the important steps in this process is to choose a name for our new parish. The Pastorate 8 transition team, composed of representatives from each parish, has recently met to discuss this matter. We thank everyone who submitted suggestions for the name. We had over 30 names to consider, reflecting the rich diversity and history of our pastorate.

The team was able to narrow the list to 7 names based on several key criteria, such as historical significance, local relevance, alignment with our faith and mission, and potential for long-term appeal. The list of names are:

- Saints Joachim and Anne Parish: The parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the grandparents of Jesus. They are the patrons of grandparents, married couples, and families. They remind us of our call to be faithful and fruitful disciples of Christ and to pass on the faith to the next generations. Saints Joachim and Anne



are models of holy parenthood, who nurtured their daughter Mary in the love of God. They taught her the Scriptures, the traditions, and the prayers of their ancestors. They also instilled in her the virtues of faith, hope, and charity, which prepared her to say yes to God's will at the Annunciation.

Saints Joachim and Anne show us the need to have families with holy parents, who may inspire their children to live a holy life. They remind us that the family is the domestic church, where the parents are the first teachers of the faith. They also encourage us to pray for our children and grandchildren, and to entrust them to God's providence.

- St. Thomas More Parish: The 16th-century English

lawyer, statesman, and martyr. He is the patron of lawyers, politicians, and public servants. He inspires us to be courageous and faithful witnesses of the truth, even at the cost of our lives. He was a devout Catholic who refused to accept King Henry VIII's claim to be the supreme head of the Church of England,



and to approve his divorce from Catherine of Aragon. He was imprisoned, tried, and executed for his loyalty to the Pope and the Catholic Church. St. Thomas More exemplifies our call to defend our Faith in the public arena, especially when it does not conform to the current fads and trends. He challenges us to be faithful to our conscience and to the teachings of the Church, even when they are unpopular or persecuted.

- Our Lady of Lourdes Parish: The title of the Blessed Virgin Mary under which she appeared to St. Bernadette Soubirous in France in 1858. She is the patroness of the sick, the poor, and those in need of conver-



sion. She invites us to pray, do penance, and trust in her maternal intercession. Our Lady of Lourdes is also connected to the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, which was proclaimed by Pope Pius IX in 1854, four years before the apparitions. When Bernadette asked the Lady her name, she replied: "I am the Immaculate Conception." This confirmed the truth of the dogma and revealed Mary's unique privilege of being preserved from original sin from the moment of her conception.

- Holy Innocents Parish: The children who were killed by King Herod in his attempt to destroy the newborn King of the Jews, Jesus Christ. They are the patrons of

children, especially those who are unborn, abused, or neglected. They challenge us to defend the dignity and sanctity of every human life, from conception



to natural death. Their name also expresses the solidarity of our pastorate with the pro-life movement, which is very active and vibrant in our area.

- Saint Isaac Jogues and the Black Robes Parish:

The 17th-century French Jesuit missionaries and martyrs who evangelized the native peoples of North America.

The name "the black robes" comes from the nickname given to the Jesuit missionaries by the Native Americans, who called them that because of their black cassocks, which are long garments worn by Catholic



priests. The Jesuits were a religious order that came to North America in the 17th century to convert the natives to Christianity, often facing danger and martyrdom. Some of the most famous "black robes" were Saint Isaac Jogues and his companions, who evangelized the Huron and Iroquois tribes.

They are the patrons of missionaries, catechists, and edu-

cators. They encourage us to share the Gospel with zeal, compassion, and respect for the culture and dignity of others. Their name also acknowledges the presence and contribution of the Native American community in our pastorate, especially the Ho-Chunk Nation, whose ancestral lands we inhabit.

- **Our Lady of Angels Parish**: The title of the Blessed Virgin Mary under which she is venerated in the Basilica

of St. Francis of Assisi in Italy. She is the patroness of the Franciscan order and of peace. She teaches us to follow the example of St. Francis, who embraced poverty, simplicity, and joy in serving God and his creation.

- Mary, Mother of Mercy Parish: The

title of the Blessed Virgin Mary that expresses her role as the mother

of Jesus Christ, who is the face of the Father's mercy. She shows us the way to obtain and extend mercy to others, especially the most vulnerable and marginalized. Her name also captures the spirit and vision of our pas-

torate, which is to be a place of mercy and healing for all who come to us. Her name also has a connection to Divine Mercy Sunday, the devotion that was revealed to St. Faustina Kowalska by Jesus, who asked for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Divine Mercy Parish was one of the first parishes in the Diocese of Madison to



celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday in a special way, with a solemn Mass, a procession, and a veneration of the Divine Mercy image. Our pastorate has a culture of mercy, which is manifested in the frequent availability of the sacrament of reconciliation, or confession, in our parishes. We offer more confessions than any other parishes in the Diocese, at various times and locations throughout the week. We believe that confession is a place of victory, where we encounter God's mercy and forgiveness.

We ask you to pray and reflect on these names and how they connect with our pastorate and the three parishes that make it up. I encourage you to participate in the survey I sent via Flocknote so we can gather your feedback and preference. 
