

MARY, MOTHER OF ME

Dear Parishioners,

As we journey through the autumn season, the Church calendar presents us with saints whose lives can offer warmth and encouragement in times of uncertainty. This is especially true of a powerful feast day we will celebrate in just over a week. On Tuesday, October 28th, we honor two of Christ's original apostles, Saints Simon and Jude. While both men were foundational pillars of our faith, devotion to St. Jude has grown immensely over the centuries, as he has become a beloved intercessor for those who feel they have nowhere else to turn.

In the Gospels, St. Jude (also called Thaddeus, perhaps to distinguish him from the betrayer, Judas Iscariot) is a quiet presence. He is listed among the Twelve Apostles, and in the Gospel of John, he asks Jesus a heartfelt question at the Last Supper: "Lord, how is it that you will manifest yourself to us, and not to the world?" (John 14:22). This single question reveals a humble and sincere heart, seeking to understand the Lord's plan.

So how did this quiet apostle become the world-renowned "Patron of Lost Causes"?

The most common reason is rooted in his name. For centuries, because of the similarity of his name to Judas Iscariot, many of the faithful were hesitant to pray for his intercession. The thinking goes that only those in the most desperate of situations—when they had exhausted every other option would turn to the apostle named Jude. As they did, they discovered a remarkably powerful friend in heaven. Time and again, prayers for his help in seemingly impossible situations were answered.

Furthermore, his own short letter in the New Testament gives us a clue. The Epistle of Jude is a powerful call for Christians to "contend for the faith" and to persevere through "harsh and difficult circumstances." He understood that the life of a believer would not be easy and encouraged early Christians to remain steadfast. This message has resonated through the ages, making him a natural source of comfort for those facing overwhelming trials.

In our own lives, we all face moments that feel hopeless. It may be an illness, a family struggle, financial uncertainty, or a crisis of faith. In these moments, the Church gives us the gift of St. Jude. He is a reminder that no cause is truly "lost" when placed in the hands of God. He is a testament to the fact that even the quietest and most overlooked among us can be vessels of immense grace.

This week, as we approach their feast day, let us ask for the prayers of Saints Simon and Jude. And if there is a situation in your life that feels impossible, do not be afraid to bring it to St. Jude. You will find a compassionate and powerful intercessor, ready to carry your needs to the very heart of Jesus.

St. Jude, Patron of Hopeless Cases, pray for us!

The altar, patio, and grotto have been dedicated to Our Blessed Mother in order to ask for her intercession for the souls of those who have taken their own life and for those who are living but struggling with suicidal thoughts, depression, and mental illness. A huge thank you to the

families of our parish who have so generously donated to this beautiful project. I believe it would be most convenient to name this corner the "Our Lady of Good Hope" Grotto, and I hope that in praying to the Blessed Virgin Mary, any family suffering from these issues may find comfort and peace. Secondly, let us all congratulate Mike and Sharon Schoepp and their family for receiving the Diocese of Madison Family of the Year Award from the Knights of Columbus! God bless you for this amazing achievement and thank you Bishop Hying for acknowledging them during the Mass this Saturday! Thirdly, given the recent shootings, especially those involving schools and places of worship, Fr. Miguel has decided to hire Nate Hutter as Head of Security for our entire pastorate. He

will be coordinating with our security team at St. Norbert as well as that of the other churches in our pastorate to ensure that we can keep all our parishioners

Nate Hutter is the son of Greg and Alice Hutter, and was raised in Sauk Prairie as a Catholic. He served in the Navy and the Intelligence community for 20 years with



14 of those years supporting Special Operations. He currently lives in Roxbury and attends Mass at Saint Aloysius. As a new security measure at St. Norbert, starting November 1st, members of the security team will be locking all doors of the church, except the front entrance, about 5 minutes after the start of Mass. Please note: no one is being locked inside the church. Anyone can leave the building at any time using the crash bars on the door; but if you need to get back in, you would need to use the front door, which will remain always open during Mass. This is to ensure that anyone entering the church at unusual times can be properly observed for the safety of all. Nate will speak at all Masses next weekend.

Recess Football Written by Jack and Rylan (5th)

One of our favorite things to do at recess is football! First we make teams, then we decide who kicks off. Next, whoever gets the ball, returns it, but if you catch it in the endzone you could also kneel it for a free 25yd line start! You get four downs to score a touchdown. The offense can either run or pass. If you don't get a touchdown in three downs, you either go for it or kick a field goal or punt on the fourth down. If you don't get a touchdown, the other team gets it.

On defense, you have to count to five apples to rush or you can blitz once per drive. If you catch it on defense your team gets the ball. You can also sack people [aka the quarterback] and they go back to where you touch them. There is no tackling. We play with one hand touch or with flags. Sometimes the rules have to change when we have uneven teams.
