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Dear Parishioners,

This past Monday I celebrated my 50th birthday, and I continue to be deeply moved by the many cards and birthday wishes I've received from so many of you. In my last article I mentioned how blessed I felt, and the blessings have only continued. I was especially touched by one note that listed moments where God allowed me to be present as a priest: "Thank you for... Confirming me. Ministering at the Catholic Newman Community in Platteville. Hearing our confessions. Counseling us. Praying for us. Praying for our family. Bringing Jesus present to us in the Eucharist. Baptizing our nieces. Burying the dead. Preparing us for marriage. Witnessing our marriage. Blessing our house. Baptizing our baby. Offering Mass... Saying yes to your call and joyfully living it out."

I thank God for these words, because all of it is His work. The priest is only an instrument of His grace. But what an honor to be such an instrument, to witness His grace at work in the lives of so many of you. The only part that was mine was to say "yes"—and only because I could never imagine doing anything else.

I also want to share an important update in our parish life. As many of you know, Margaret Nelson will be retiring this December after nearly twenty years of faithful service to our parish. Her dedication and professionalism have blessed us in countless ways, and we thank her most sincerely.

Beginning this October, the Diocese of Madison will assume the bookkeeping responsibilities for our parish, and once we merge into a single parish next year, the Diocese will continue in that role. Even so, we will still need someone in the parish office to take on many of the other important tasks Margaret has carried out—supporting the parish, school, and cemeteries, assisting with parish records, and helping with parish events. The position may not be called "finance manager" in the future, but it will remain an essential part of our parish life.

We are now accepting applications for this position. The exact title and hours (full-time or part-time) will be determined once diocesan bookkeeping is fully in place, but the role will combine office administration, parish-level financial oversight, and general parish management.

If you or someone you know would like to serve the Church in this important way, please submit a resume and cover letter to the parish office.

Please keep Margaret in your prayers as she prepares for her retirement, and join me in asking the Lord to guide us in finding the right person to step into this role of service for our parish.

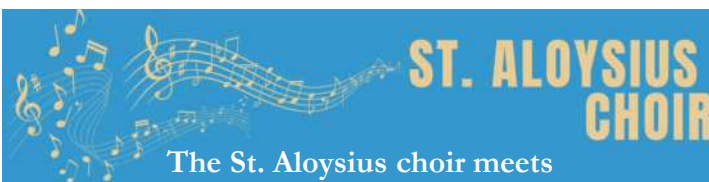

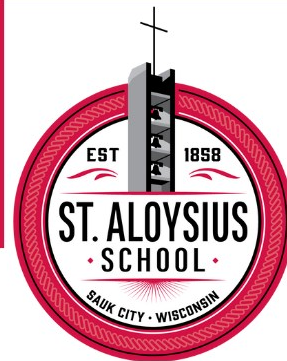

2. You can **choose to link a bank account** which has a \$0.29 convenience fee, **use a debit card** which has a 1% convenience fee, **or pay the coordinator directly** with a check which has no fee.
3. Ecards are ready right away if paying by debit card or bank account. Paying by check takes longer.
