## GO MAKE DISCIPLES TIP OF THE MONTH

The GMD April tip of the Month is explaining what the Easter season really means. The Easter season is fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ to Pentecost. The first eight days of the Easter season make up the Octave of Easter and are celebrated as solemnities of the Lord. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday. During the Easter season the Paschal Candle, a symbol of the presence of the Risen Christ among the people of God, remains in the sanctuary near the Altar or Ambo until Pentecost Sunday. An overview of the liturgical season known as Easter which is represented by the liturgical color white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored).

1. Opening Prayer: Fr. James Kotch
2. Minutes of November 29, 2022 meeting read by Parish Council Secretary, Mary Briggs and approved as read.

**Old Business:**

3. Financial Update: Fr. James Kotch
  - A. Minutes from March 15, 2023 St. Norbert Finance Council Meeting was shared by Fr. James.
  - B. Status of Capital Campaign  
Collected: Window project donations: \$164,455.00.  
Renovation project donations collected to date is \$1,187,065.54.  
All invoices are paid for both projects.  
Remaining Capital Campaign pledges will be collected over next few years: \$44,075
4. Building and Grounds Report: Fr. James Kotch
  - A. Speakers and Microphone update completed and feedback on effectiveness sought by Fr. James. Generally good reports from parishioners. Choir mics will be checked for feedback.
  - B. Video Camera for TV in Church hall now is updated and installed. Quality is very good.
  - C. Issue with the tower bells has been addressed and completed by Verdin Company in time for Holy Week and Easter Season.
  - D. Maintenance committee established. Members are: Brad Walsh, Stephen Howard, Nick Ballweg, Chris Schmitt, Chad Hellenbrand, Chad Brickl, Jerome Ballweg, Jackey Drone, Mary Briggs, Juanita Wipperfurth, and Tim Knobloch. Maintenance Committee members met and did a walk around the church grounds to assess repair priorities. Maintenance Committee is in the early stages of planning for sacristy stairway repairs. Maintenance committee will meet to discuss any bids and present their findings to entire Parish Council through email vote. Once approvals are reached, Finance Committee will receive final bids and they will make a motion to move ahead or seek other bids as needed. Information will then go out to all Parish Council members through email vote due to limited frequency of general Parish Council meetings. Other prioritized projects are the parking lot crack filling and resealing. Bids will be sought soon. Brad stated that the Finance Committee sees these projects will be well funded.
  - E. Nick Ballweg from Endres Manufacturing Company presented his company's overview of initial planning for exterior stairways to sacristies. No official bid yet made. Handicapped ramp was not part of this review and would require another contractor's bid. Options were presented to the council and discussed.
  - F. Juanita Wipperfurth stated the Catholic Mutual Inspection came through well. Tempered glass needs to be installed under vigil lights for fire safety.
  - G. Christmas decoration report by Brad Walsh: Set up and take down went very well, with many volunteers.
  - H. Fellowship Sunday Follow up:
    - January – Megan and Juanita. Went well and had about 25 people.
    - February – Doug and Julianne. Went well. Attendance not recorded.
    - March – Mary and Juanita. Went well. 50 people attended.

## **New Business**

- A. Senior Mass is Sunday, May 21, 2023. Megan Lewis requested help. Juanita agree to assist her.
- B. Juanita shared that the Bulletin Sponsor Recruitment letter will tentatively be sent out in May due to uncertainty of planning for Into the Deep.
- C. Fr. James shared some info concerning Into the Deep. All priests of the Society of Jesus Christ the Priest will remain with their current sites and community life. Fr. Miguel will be Parish Administrator. More details will be shared as the Bishop clarifies new guidelines.
- D. Traditional Latin Mass will transfer to St. Cecelia, Wisconsin Dells and St. Mary, Pine Bluff in July. The TLM Community will offer a farewell Solemn High Mass on June 30, 2023, the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and host a potluck to follow Mass for the entire parish as a send-off and thank you. More information will be posted in the bulletin.
- E. Confirmation is May 24, 2023. Confirmation takes place at Divine Mercy Parish, Sauk City for all combined parishes. Bibles for each St. Norbert confirmand will be attained and wrapped by Mary Briggs and Mary Markielewski.
- F. Brat Stand is May 26 – 29, 2023 in Piggly Wiggly, Sauk City parking lot. Chris Schmitt and Sharon Schoepp will coordinate. Chris will secure the Binder with all the needed information to make it a great event. Date to be confirmed with Kim at Piggly Wiggly. Goal is to have a Parish Council member lead each shift. Sign up sheets will be placed in back of Church.
