

Dear Parishioners,

As we gather with family and friends this Thanksgiving week, our hearts and homes are filled with a welcome sense of warmth and gratitude. But at its core, this holiday is more than just a tradition; it is one of the most profound ways we worship God. True thanksgiving is an act of worship because, in it, we acknowledge His supreme goodness toward us.

This is the first and most important reminder of the holiday. Think about the phrase, "I'm thankful." It doesn't make sense to just "be thankful" in a vacuum. The object of our thanksgiving is always directed at someone who we recognize as the giver. We are not thankful to impersonal things, like the weather or "good fortune." We are thankful to a Someone who we realize is good to us. That Someone is God.

This leads to the other vital aspect of thanksgiving. We acknowledge that what God gives us is a free gift. We do not merit His graces, His love, or His goodness. We don't deserve the blessings we receive. True thanksgiving recognizes the fundamental truth of our existence: God is God, and we are His creatures. We owe everything to Him.

And there is so much joy in that.

To be truly thankful is to be always joyful, because we learn to constantly see everything as a gift from God, no matter how small. This perspective opens our eyes and allows us to see the beauty and goodness in everything.

This practice doesn't just bring joy; it builds an unshakeable trust in God. When we are constantly acknowledging His unmerited goodness, we come to know Him as a loving Father who always wants what is good for us.

This trust is so profound that it can even extend to the "bad" things that we sometimes think happen to us. As the French author George Bernanos once said, "Everything is grace." When our hearts are rooted in thanksgiving, we can trust that even the evils we suffer can be blessings in disguise, permitted by a Father who can bring a greater good out of every situation.

This week, as we gather around the table, let's go beyond a simple "thanks." Let's enter into true worship, thanking our loving Father for gifts we did not earn, for a love we do not deserve, and for a goodness that sustains us every moment.

May you and your loved ones have a joyful and truly blessed Thanksgiving.



SECURITY UPDATE





ST. ALOYSIUS CEMETERY RULES & REGULATIONS

Please respect the following rules for the safety of those who care for our cemetery:

- Please do **not** insert wire or anything on wire into the ground.
- * Seasonal flowers may be planted within 12 inches of the front or back of monuments. Please do **not** plant or place things on the **sides** of monuments.
- * Rose bushes, miniature rose bushes, ferns, shrubs, trees or any plants that tend to spread are **not** allowed.
- * Gravel or decorative stone for mulch is **not** allowed.
- * Brick, stone or any type of edging is **not** allowed
- * Vases, jars, or other objects made of glass or anything breakable are **not** allowed.
- * Bird houses, bird feeders and bird baths are **not** allowed.
- * One Plant stands/hangers/shepherd's hooks per monument. They must be removed before the ground freezes.
- * Everyone is responsible for their own planting, care and removal of plants.


