GO MAKE DISCIPLES TIP OF THE MONTH

The GMD April tip of the Month is explaining what the Easter season really means. The Easter season is fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ to Pentecost. The first eight days of the Easter season make up the Octave of Easter and are celebrated as solemnities of the Lord. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the initial day. In a sense, every day of the Octave is like a little Sunday. During the Easter season the Paschal Candle, a symbol of the presence of the Risen Christ among the people of God, remains in the sanctuary near the Altar or Ambo until Pentecost Sunday. An overview of the liturgical season known as Easter which is represented by the liturgical color white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored).
