

They have been overwhelmed by the love, the messages, the meals, and most importantly, the constant prayers. Connor remains in critical condition and has a very long and difficult road ahead. Please continue to hold him, Jada, and their boys in your prayers. Let us continue to be their strength and support in this profound time of need.

On a different note, I am excited to share a quick update on our parish facilities. For several months, our parish Building Committee has been working diligently with the architects from River Arts to come up with a plan for a much-needed renovation of St. Aloysius.

We are very excited about the initial concepts. This project will finally allow us to address the long-standing structural issues with our bell tower and also give us the opportunity to add other much-needed facilities that our growing parish family has needed for a long time.

Very soon, we will have our vision phase completed and will be able to share it with the entire pastorate. This is an exciting step forward for us all. Looking ahead, we plan to launch a capital campaign sometime next year to raise the funds for this important renovation project.

Please keep the committee in your prayers as they continue this important work. We will be sharing more details about the vision and the campaign in the coming weeks and months.



SECURITY UPDATE


