

How to fulfill 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas Day Holy Days of Obligation:

Since both are days of obligation, we cannot fulfill both obligations with one Mass. We need to attend two separate Masses, one for each solemnity. However, we have some flexibility in choosing which Masses to attend, as long as they are celebrated at different times of the day.

The obligation for the **Fourth Sunday of Advent** may be fulfilled at any Mass from the evening of Saturday, December 23 and throughout the entire day of Sunday, December 24. That is, you can attend the anticipated Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent on Saturday evening, or any Mass (even a Vigil Mass for Christmas) on Sunday.

The obligation for **Christmas** may be fulfilled from the evening of Sunday, December 24 and throughout Monday, December 25. That is, you can attend any evening Mass (after 4 pm) on Sunday, or any Mass on Monday.



Adoration Chapel

Merry Christmas faithful Adorers!

Thank you all for your dedication to our Lord! It is because of you, we are able to keep our adoration chapel going. Your dedication remains strong and your prayers for our chapel are so appreciated. I look back over the years at the lives that have been transformed, the

prayers that have been answered and the miracles witnessed and I am truly amazed and in awe of the awesome power of God! This is also a time for us to reflect on where we are at and where we would like to go.

We *need* this adoration chapel. We as individuals, we as a parish, we as a community, we as a family and we've never needed this beautiful and peaceful place to talk and adore our Lord more than we do now. When

the world attacks, the faithful fall...to their knees. We rise up, by kneeling down, in humble prayer. There is not a care or a worry that we can't take to Jesus. He will heal us, restore us, transform us, but we need to ask.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraph 2725 says that "prayer is both a gift of grace and a determined response on our part." It's grace and grit! We pray as we live because we live as we pray. The Catechism further states that If we do not want to act habitually according to the Spirit of Christ, neither can we pray habitually in his name. How we live is inseparable from

how we pray. Paragraph 2710 states "One does not undertake contemplative prayer only when one has the time. One makes time for the Lord with the firm determination not to give up." Which leads me to one of my current favorite quotes from Fr. Mike Schmitz; "We can't pray at all times unless



we pray at specific times." To me, my friends this means we must have a dedicated prayer life, setting aside specific times to speak to our Lord. Yes we can do this at home, but do we? Our adoration chapel gives us this beautiful opportunity to set aside a specific time to be with Iesus. To come to

Him, to kneel before Him who has given us so much, to give to Him for one hour, our time, our attention, our hearts. We *need* this chapel and we need more people to fill hours and open our schedule up to what it was (or more) pre-covid. As we experience the joy of the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ, we ask you to please consider adding an hour of adoration weekly, bi-weekly or monthly to add some grit to the grace He gives us. You won't regret it, I promise you that! Religious Education

As you may know, our diocese is undergoing a strategic planning process called Into the Deep, which aims to help us move from "maintenance to mission" and to align our resources to more effectively spread the Gospel. One of the aspects of this process is to evaluate and improve our religious education program for our children and youth. After much prayer and consultation with Bishop Hying, we have decided to adopt a new model of religious education based on Family Catechesis. This model recognizes that parents are the primary educators of their children in the faith, and that the parish's role is to support and equip them in this mission. Family Catechesis combines parishbased group meetings and grade-specific instruc-

tion by trained catechists with at-home sessions guided by parents. This way, parents can grow in their own faith while they help their children learn and live the Catholic faith.



What is Family Catechesis?

Family catechesis is a form of religious education that involves the whole family, not just the children. It recognizes that parents are the primary educators of their children in the faith, and that the family is the first and most important place where children learn about God and the Church. Family catechesis also fosters a sense of community among families, by bringing them together to share their joys and struggles, to support and encourage each other, and to celebrate their faith.

How does it work?

The Family Catechesis Program will consist of two Wednesday night sessions a month, from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm. Each session will begin with a meal and fellowship, where families can enjoy some quality time with each other and with other families. After the meal, catechists will teach the children in their respective grade levels, while one of the priests or a speaker will teach the adults on various topics related to the faith. Parents will also receive a parent's guide, which will help them to teach their children at home using the materials provided by the parish. Confirmation students will

be required to attend more sessions in the parish, as part of their preparation for the sacrament.

We would like to thank all our parishioners for their participation in the Re-

ligious Education program. It has been very joyful to see so many parents and students becoming closer to Jesus through our faith. A special thank you to all the Catechists, classroom helpers, daycare help, and all those who have been helping with the meals, setting up and cleaning up; it has been very much appreciated.
