





# DIABETES AWARENESS MONTH





The month of November has a special place in our hearts because it is Diabetes Awareness Month. Friends, Helen and Rosie, sat down to have a conversation about diabetes. Rosie, who lives with diabetes every day, was diagnosed in 2019. When asked how she felt when she first found out, Rosie said, "I felt shocked and scared at first. But then when I got to the hospital, I felt comforted." Diabetes is a condition where the body cannot produce its own insulin, leading to high blood sugar levels. Rosie has specific medicine and special tools to help her control and keep track of her blood sugar numbers. When she eats carbs, she needs to give herself medicine, which she calls a "bolus." Sometimes this means she has to practice patience and wait to eat until her body is ready. Rosie says now she can give herself the bolus. Diabetes has taught her many things. She has overcome her fear of needles and become more independent through the years since she was diagnosed. It has helped her grow in virtues like self-control and humility. When asked what lesson she wants to teach people about diabetes, Rosie said, "People with diabetes can do everything you can do!" She is always willing to answer a question from anyone and teach everyone about diabetes.
