Dear Parishioners,

As we enter the season of Advent this Sunday, let us prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Advent is a time of hope and joy. It is also a time to practice the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, visiting the sick, and praying for the living and the dead.

Many of you have practiced those works of Mercy last week helping others in the community. I want to express my heartfelt gratitude for your generous donations on Giving Tuesday. Thanks to your kindness and generosity, we have raised \$7,200 so far to help a local Catholic family in financial distress. This family has been struggling with medical bills, unemployment, and other hardships for a long time. They are very grateful for your support and prayers. Your donations will make a huge difference in their lives and help them overcome their difficulties.

One of the highlights of Advent is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, which we celebrate on December 8th. This is a Holy Day of Obligation, which means that we are obliged to attend Mass and honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Immaculate Conception is the dogma that Mary was conceived without original sin, by the grace of God, in view of the merits of her Son. This means that Mary was preserved from the stain of sin from the first moment of her existence, and remained sinless throughout her life. She is the model of holiness and purity for all Christians.

The Immaculate Conception is important for several reasons. First, it shows us the power and mercy of God, who can do all things and who wants to save us from sin and death. Second, it shows us the dignity and beauty of human nature, which God created in his image and likeness, and which he redeemed by his Son. Third, it shows us the role and mission of Mary, who is the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church. She is our advocate, intercessor, and protector. She is the perfect disciple of Christ and the exemplar of faith, hope, and love.

I invite you to celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception with devotion and joy. Let us ask Mary to pray for us and to help us imitate her virtues. Let us also thank her for her *fiat*, her yes to God, which made possible the Incarnation and the Redemption. Let us honor her as the Immaculate Conception, full of grace, the blessed among women, and the cause of our joy.

May God bless you and your families during this Advent season. May he fill you with his grace and his love. And may he grant you a merry and holy Christmas.




